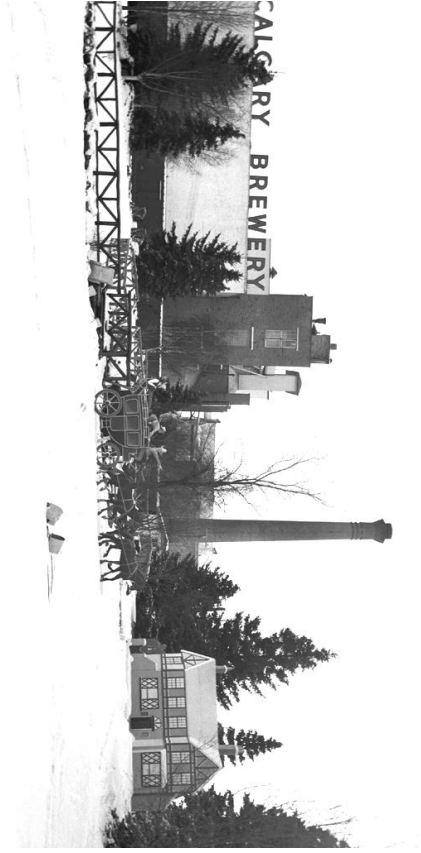


*Brewery Gardens decorated for the Christmas season 1950  
at the Calgary Brewing and Malting Company*



The Calgary Brewing and Malting Co. site includes buildings and gardens dating back to 1892. Founded by rancher-industrialist A.E. Cross, one of the “Big Four” financiers of the original Stampede, it was Alberta’s first brewery and is one of its oldest industrial sites. The site has a deep connection to its Ingleswood neighbourhood (formerly “Brewery Flats”), to Calgary, and to Alberta through employment, the “Calgary Beer” brand, and the lives of the Cross family. Generations of Calgarians enjoyed the gardens, fish hatchery and trout ponds, aquarium, and Horseman’s Hall of Fame. As of Christmas 2009, some of the most historic sections of the brewery site face demolition. With adaptive re-use, this site can once again be a valued heart of economic and social life in Calgary and have many Christmases to come.
